New Waste Disposal Arrangement

From now on you must use the new containers. The containers are buried underground, you will find them next to the parking lot.

The first container is for **household rubbish**, the second for **clean paper** and the third is for **glass** (bottles).

To access the containers please use the key for your room – it will fit the lock.



Save money!

Here you can see how to sort and dispose of your waste.

In general, the hall of residence can save money if everyone makes sure to sort his or her waste correctly. The hall of residence must pay to dispose of household rubbish, but all other waste is picked up for free. Therefore, it is important, that the containers for collecting household rubbish are only used for this purpose.

Waste is sorted in the following categories:

Household rubbish

Household rubbish must be taken to the underground container marked “**Dagrenovation**”.

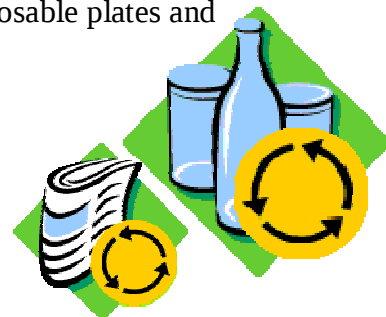
The rubbish must be put in bags **closed with a knot** to prevent rubbish from falling out in the container, and preventing a mess with foul smell.

Household rubbish is kitchen waste which cannot be recycled. For example leftovers, dirty paper, pizza boxes, milk and juice cartons, china, dust bags, aluminium trays and foil, disposable plates and cigarettes.

Glass

Glass must be put in the container for bottles and glass marked “**Flasker**”.

Glass is for instance wine and alcohol bottles, preserving jars etc.



Paper

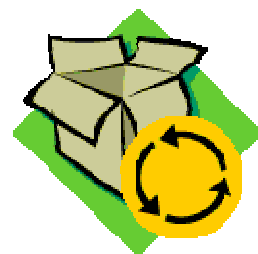
Paper must be put in the container marked “**Papir**”.

Here you put news papers/weekly papers, advertising folders/printed papers, writing and drawing paper, phone books

Cardboard

In the basement, just inside the entrance from the parking lot, there is a sign on the wall. Here you may leave your clean cardboard. The caretaker will remove it for you.

Cardboard boxes must be folded and with no polystyrene inside.



Bulky waste

Bulky waste must be taken to the shed next to Fuglesangs Allé. The caretaker will see to the necessary sorting and removal of the waste.

Bulky waste is furniture, carpets, duvets, mattresses, polystyrene, computers, television sets, radios, vacuum cleaners, electric shavers, hair dryers, cameras, batteries etc.
